**HOW TO STABILIZE BUSINESS**

Business for stabilizing business  
is the subject of a most interesting  
chapter in the report of the National  
Bureau of Economic Research  
just issued by Secretary Hoover un-  
der the auspices of the Committee  
on Unemployment and Business  
Cycles of President's Harding's re-  
cent Commission. The material pre-  
sented is the result of nation-wide  
inquiries conducted by the Taylor  
Society, the Association of Business  
Press Editors and the Federated  
American Engineering Societies.

The results show that American  
business enterprises have tried only  
to a limited extent to develop and  
apply methods of counteracting fluc-  
tuations in industrial activity. Re-  
sults to a questionnaire indicate var-  
ious methods of stabilization, many  
of them only expedients made neces-  
sary by depression and not methods  
not deliberately planned in advance.  
There is little evidence  
of organized effort to stabilize  
the business cycle.

Manufacturers recognize the need  
of extensive use of statistical infor-  
mation in formulating their produc-  
tion programs and business policies  
and obviously it would be a service  
to the country if this information  
could be compiled and disseminated  
by some public agency, as the Gov-  
ernment now forecasts weather con-  
ditions.

Some interesting material is sup-  
plied in answer to a question as to  
the accumulation of reserve funds  
during periods of prosperity to take  
care of business during depression  
and the uses to which they are put.  
Long-range planning of construct-  
ion work is shown to be confined to  
a very small proportion of the  
firms replying. Similarly, efforts to  
relieve workmen laid off are still  
rudimentary, and depression insur-  
ance is rare.

The conclusion from the data  
studied is that the necessity for pre-  
dicting and preparing for approach-  
ing economic changes in the major  
cycle and taking advantage of them  
before such changes occur, appears  
not yet to be recognized as a busi-  
ness principle of general applica-  
tion.

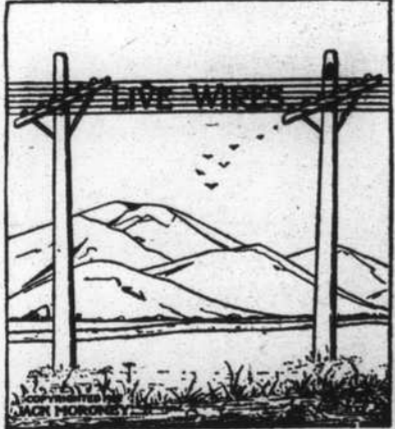
