

I er shows that, based upon conon figures for the past years and brenze screen cloth will up ten per cent of the tel a sloth consumption, or 55,000. square feet, consuming a ters \$,250,000 pounds of coppar cloth, which makes up 43. square feet of the total, con 90 par cent copper.


