MAKE THE PEOPLE PARTNERS

Discussion of Muscle Shoals has
been extensive since acceptance of
Henry Ford's offer by the House of
Representatives which puts matter
before Senate for action.

In developing this great property
it is suggested that, instead of making
it a one-man proposition, a great
utility holding company be organized,
the stocks and bonds of which would
be offered to the American people,
and particularly to the sections served.
Thus, customer ownership and interest
in the undertaking would build up
real democratic control and administration
of the national asset.

With due respect to Mr. Ford's remarkable
genius and ability, the advisability
of considering such a program is
emphasized by the following extracts
from an editorial in the Manufacturers
Record of Baltimore, dated March 20,
which says in part:
"Henry Ford is probably far and
away the richest man in America, if
not in the world.

"Directly violating the law of the
land, which forbids the granting of
water power rights to anyone beyond
50 years the House of Representatives
votes to give to Mr. Ford the control
of Muscle Shoals for 100 years; and to
do it at a price which would practically
within the next 15 or 20 years,
if he should live that long enable him
to double the wealth which he already
has, and to do it to a considerable
extent at the expense of the
other interests.

"Whether it be feasible to develop
full 900,000 horsepower or not as
many have claimed can be done by
construction of reservoirs in mountains
from which the Tennessee River runs,
the amount is so great that if
given to Mr. Ford on his terms it
would enable him if he desired, to
dominate entire industrial situation
to destruction of many interests and
harming development of other possible
industries.

No man would want to attempt
to develop hydro-electric power in
Central South if he had to compete
with Ford's power granted to him
practically without cost.

"This is probably the most stupen-
dous, monumental gift which any nation
has ever planned to make to a
single individual.

It is dangerous to the extreme, it
would add to Mr. Ford's power an un-
limited possibility for controlling all
other power interests in the South. Having
Muscle Shoals practically without
cost paid for by the National Government
he could if desired sell power at a
price which would well-nigh if no
quite bankrupt other power producers
until he could force their way
down to a point which would enable
him to absorb them on a basis as
that which the House of Representatives
has offered to give him.

"Throughout the South here and

the are fully cognizant
of the dangerous danger em-
bedded in the proposition. They cannot
afford to sit still and say nothing.
They cannot afford to risk the future
of their section by acquiescing in this
grant. If all the claims for his altru-
ism made by Mr Ford's friends were
wholly true, he cannot live indefinitely
and no man can say who would
follow after him in the domain of his
gigantic scheme.

"But under no condition should this
great power be granted for 100
years to Mr. Ford, or to anyone else;
under no consideration should this
property be leased except on a basis
somewhat commensurate with its value.

BUILDING COMPANIES PROSPER

(By Associated Press)
Cleveland, May 2.—Building, sav-
ings and loan companies during last
year made the largest growth in their
history according to Miss Ann E. Rae
of Niagara Falls president who was
here making arrangements for the or-
ganization's convention July 23-25.
There are now more than 10,000
loan companies in the United States,
which serve more than seven million
persons, Miss Rae said. Ohio associa-
tions have just stepped into first place
among the states with assets exceed-
ing \$650,000,000 and serving 1,700,000
persons.

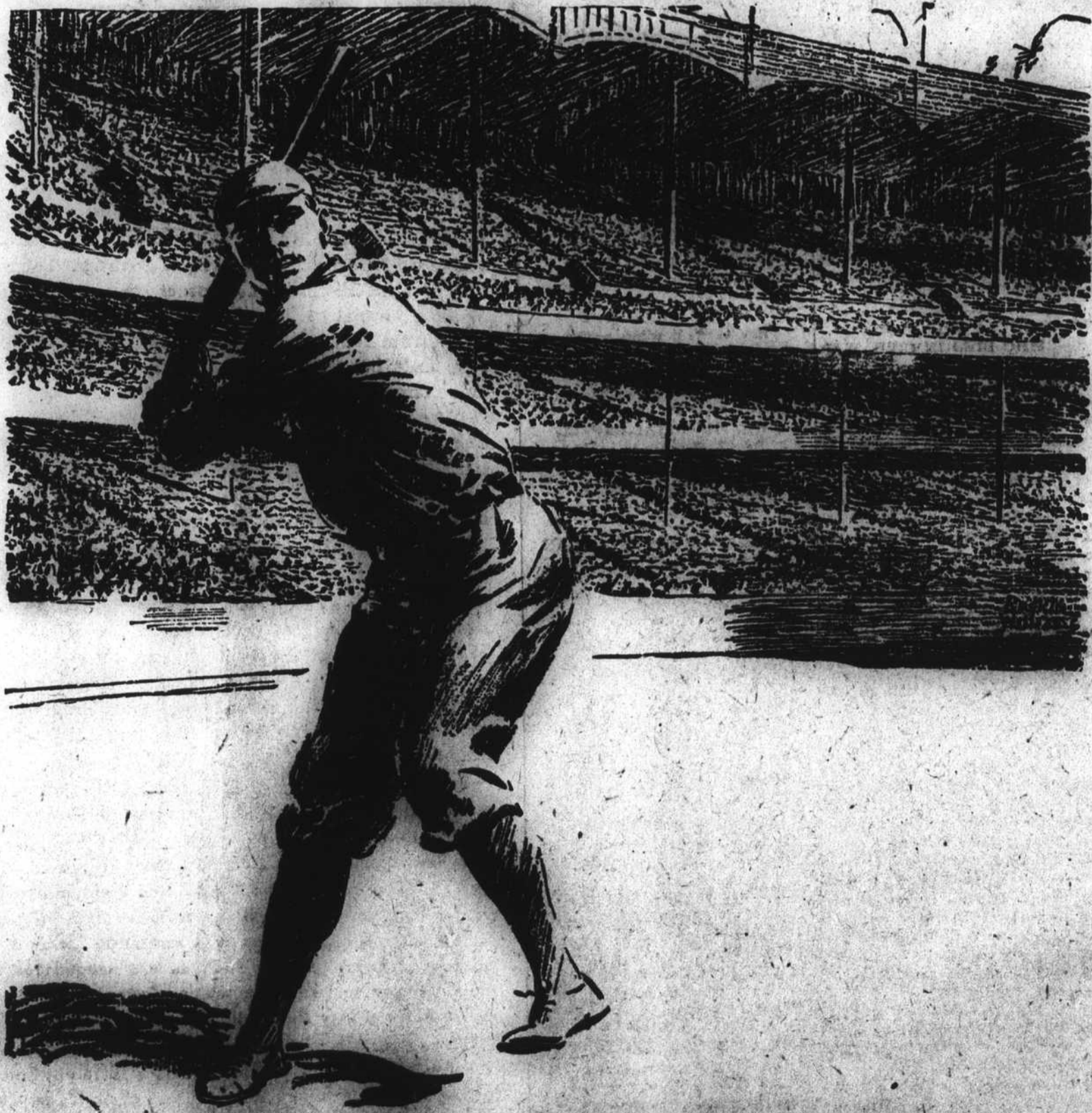
