THE MAY HEALTH BULLETIN

The Argonne forest at the heigh of the drive against the Hindenburg line was a safe place for the Ameri, can soldier as compared with the salety of the average North Carolin. home for the baby that comes to it is a declaration in the May issue 5 the Health Bulletin of the Stat Deard of Health. Of each one hundre habies born in the State, eight dibefore reaching the first birthday. O all the deaths occurring in the State nearly a fourth are of babies les than two years old.

The month of May generally records the highest mortality among infantsu nder two years of age of any month in the year, with the possible exception of September. The greater number of these deaths occur on ac count of mistakes through ignorance resulting from incorrect feeding and improper care, though quite a num ber are caused by polluted water or infected milk. The latter two sources of infant mertality during the sum mer could be entirely removed thru the simple expedient of boiling for three minutes all water an! al' millwhich is given to babies. The mistaker in feeding and care resulting from ignorance present a more difficult problem.

In the effort to afford accurate and an horitative information of practical helpfulness to mothers, the current inte of the Health Bulletin is 'argely deroted to the feeding and care of competent baby specialists in the things equivalent to personal service, State.
