### GOVERNM'NT WAS POSTED

London, May 18 .- Cusement will go on trial for treason early in June, was stated today. Daniel Bailey also will be tried then.

The British Government knew several days in advance that Irish rebels planned an open revolt, but didn't disarm them fearing great bloodshed, according to an admission from Sir Matthew Nathan, who resigned as under secretary for Ireland following the rebellion, to the Royal Commission appointed to investigate the outbreak. He said that three days before the Dublin revolt began he government learned that the Irish leaders had been informed that the Germans would cooperate with them in a great fland, sea and air offensive. He said the Irish constabulary were immediately warned the coast pairelled day and night, and that it was undoubtedly due to these precautions that Casement was captured a few hours after he landed.
