Salisbury, Nov. 16.—Fletcher F. Smith died early this morning as a result of a stroke of paralysis he suffered yesterday morning. Mr. Smith has been in ill health for some months but was recently able to be out and was up town Saturday. The funeral service will be conducted tomorrow afternoon at 2:30 o'clock from St. Luke's Episcopal church of which Mr. Smith was a member and the interment will be at Chestnut Hill.
Mr. Smith was one of the city's leading business men. He was head of three local drug stores and held directorates in a number of business enterprises. For 20 years he was a traveling man covering the South for a large clothing house, but some years ago he settled down in this city and became identified with its interests. He was known as the father of the industrial club which he organized and he engineered several big occasions for this city and section.
