On the 30th of November a convention of business men was held in New Orleans to consider the Nicaragua enterprise. The total length of the ocean to ocean is 169 miles, but Lake Nicaragua can be utilized for 100 miles and the San Juan river for 42 miles, leaving only about 20 miles to be excavated. The cost will be less than \$100,000,000, and the canal can be completed by 1895.—Charlotte Democrat.
