To Be Punched if They Smoke.

Eight boys in West Hobeoken have organized an anti-tobacco league and have agreed to punish all violators of their code with "hard punches" for each offence. The articles of agreement adopted by the league are as follows: "We, the undersigned, do hereby agree to form a non-smokers' league. The object of the league is to stop its members from smoking by imposing a fine upon them which shall consist of five hard punches for the first offence and ten hard punches for each subsequent offence. We all agree not to smoke cigarettes, cigars, sweet corn or catcalls, and not to chew out pipe or any other tobacco. We shall let this take effect Wednesday, July 22, 1903, to continue for fifty days, or until Thursday, September 10, 1903. Any one leaving this league before the term expires will be fined fifty punches. If a member is found to have cigarettes, sweet corn or pipe in his possession, it shall be taken from him. If he refuses to surrender it, he shall be fined five punches for each article found on him. We all pledge ourselves not to break this agreement, and shall be satisfied to receive the fives if we do."

Exodus of Negroes from Charlotte to New York.

What is claimed to be the largest exodus of colored people from Charlotte yet known, will take place this morning, when about 40 families, numbering 100 men, women and children, will leave for the North. This will probably aggregate of 250 colored people leaving the city within one week. As has been stated, those who are leaving are among the better class of negroes; the men being able bodied laborers, and the women cooks who have been employed in the best families here. The crowd will be ticketed to New York, where the women are offered positions as cooks and servants, and the men are promised jobs as laborers in the subway and in building.
