

Washington Dispatch, Dec. 16. President Wilson's marriage license was issued today at the local municipal bureau. It disclosed for the first time that the ceremony Sat-urday night will be performed by a clergyman of Mrs. Galt's faith, the Rev. Herbert Scott Smith, rector of St. Margaret's Episcopal Church. The President himself is a Presbyterian and an elder in his Church.

The license was issued to Chief Usher Hoover of the White House staff, who went to the bureau, n.ade out the necessary forms and paid the regular fee. Afterward, he delivered the document to the President. In the application the President's age was given as 59 years and Mrs. Gait's

The wedding ceremony will be performed at Mrs. Galt's home Saturday night probably about 9 o'clock, although the hour has not been announced, in keeping with the desire of the couple to have the affair strictly a private one.
