They asserted that German agencie have been active in stirring up feel only in Mexico, but throughout South and Central America, to preven this country from securing trade formerly controlled by German mer

It is understood that the diple mats have pointed out to General Carranza that the American notonly declines to consider immedately any suggestion that its troop be withdrawn from Mexico and tha it quotes a portion of the agree between General Scott and General Obregon, providing for the gradula withdrawal of the forces.
