It reproduces letters taken from the files of one of the packers, showing that such agreed price existed.

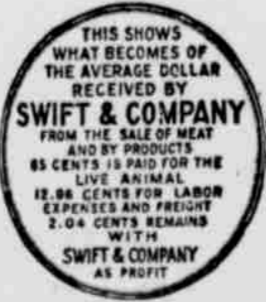
But it failed to mention that the agreed price was determined at the request of and in co-operation with the Food Administration!

### RUSSIA ISN'T HOPELESS.

France and England Experienced the Same Conditions at One Time.

Trinity College, Durham, Oct. 9.—The condition of Russia is not hopeless and the same elements of the nation will eventually gain the ascendancy, was the gist of a statement made by Dr. William Laprade to his class in European history, of which the erstwhile lengthy member of The Journal force is a member, a few days ago.

Dr. Laprade proceeded to show that both England and France had experienced almost the same conditions as now prevail in Russia before they adopted a stable and sane government. In England from the time of the beheading of Charles I to the overthrow of Richard Cromwell the country experienced a series of upheavals. It required about fifteen years following the death of Charles for the nation to settle down to a normal state. Conditions were worse in France during the Revolution, which was featured by the Reign of Terror. It was pointed out by Dr. Laprade that his reasons on these historical facts Dr. Laprade is optimistic concerning the future of Russia. He called attention to the fact that it has been only about three years since the revolution in Russia which resulted in the overthrow of the Romanoff dynasty and if the country succeeds in setting up a sane, stable government in the next decade she will have advanced as rapidly as did England of France following the revolutions in these countries.

Touching upon the tendency of the times toward strikes and unrest in the same lecture, Dr. Laprade expressed the opinion that it is the outcome of a process by which the masses who have since the foundation of nations been on the bottom, are rising in a realization of their power and mean to control things. The belief that the well-to-do and substantial folk who have hitherto controlled the government of all nations will have to give way to the masses was voiced. If when the masses gain the ascendancy they treat the classes which have been accustomed to control things as the latter treated the masses; then the device is going to be to play, declared Dr. Laprade.

### Tax Payer Seeks Information.

### Teachers' Examination.

Teachers' examination for State Certificates will be held in the assembly hall of the Chamber of Commerce, Monroe, N. C., October 14 and 15. Teachers who wish to secure any sort of certificate whether it be High School, Elementary or County certificate will please report to the County Superintendent on the morning of October 14th at nine o'clock.

There are three groups of subjects on which teachers are required to stand. Group A, the professional group, will be given on the morning of the fourteenth. This group includes Lelper, Rapeer, School Law, Klapper (high school) and Strayer (high school.) Group B, includes spelling, reading, language, grammar and drawing. This group will be given on the afternoon of October 14. Group C, the science group, will be on the morning of October 15. This group includes arithmetic, geography, hygiene and agriculture. Group D, the history group, will be on the afternoon of October 15. This group includes North Carolina history, United States history and civics.

Those teachers who have to stand on only one or two groups will report at the time when those examinations will be given. The subjects will be given at the time indicated above.

This is the last examination to be held this year and it is necessary that teachers secure certificates, for the State refuses to appropriate funds to those schools whose teachers do not have certificates.

White and colored teachers will report on the same day, October 14, at the Chamber of Commerce hall over Bank of Union.

The king of Belgium en route from Toledo, Ohio, to Chicago, drove the engine of his train for ten miles. He has a thorough knowledge of locomotive engineering.

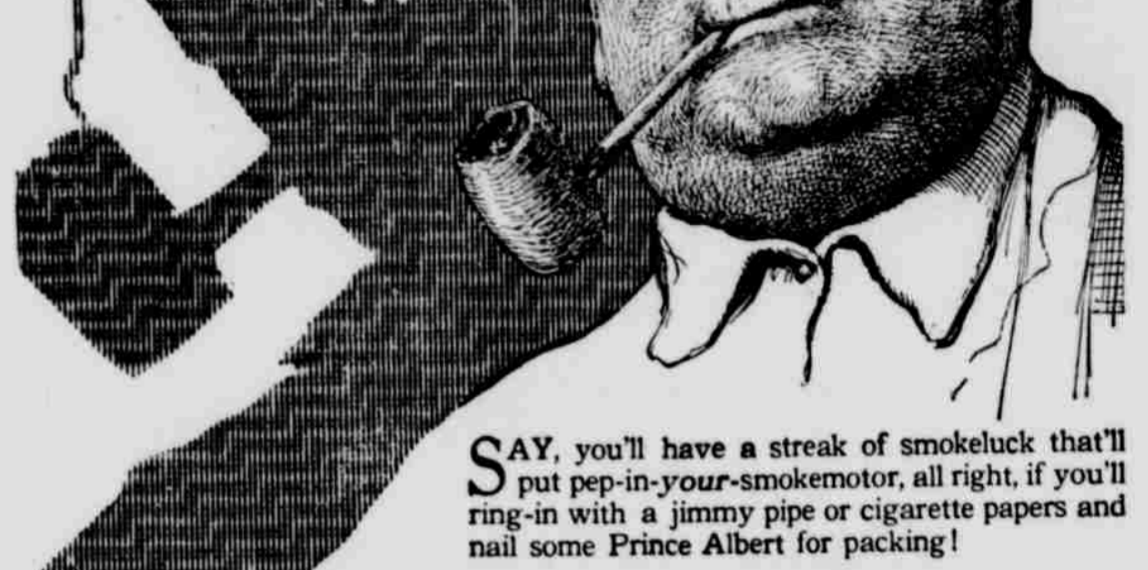

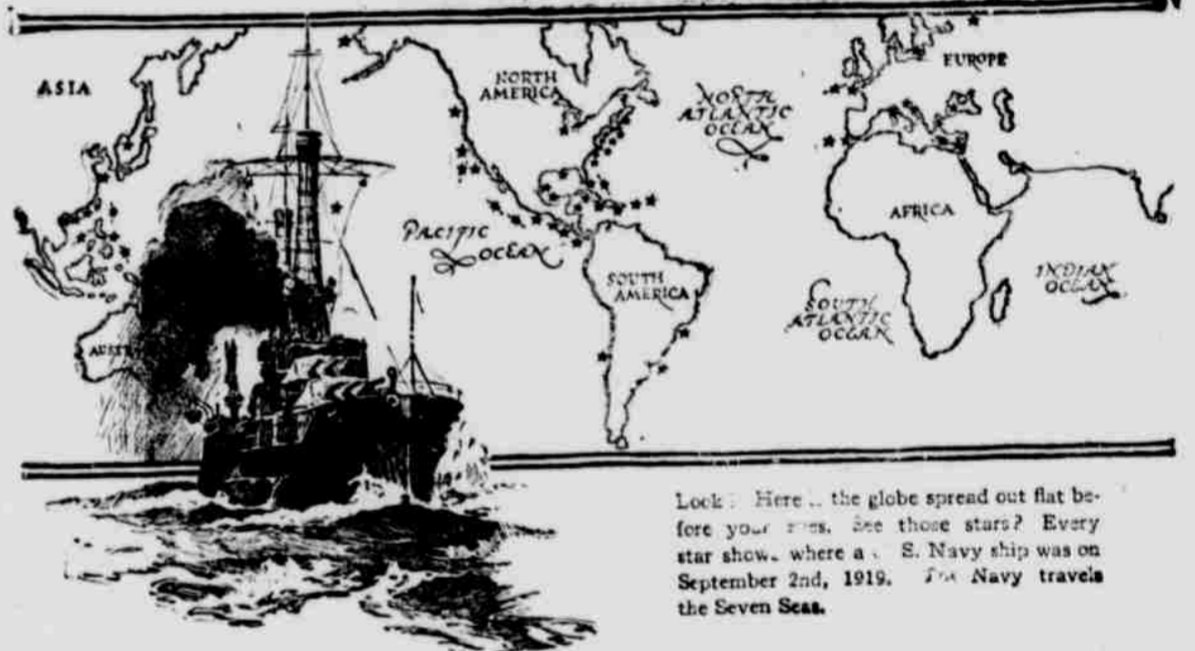
