Bishop Condemns Modern Sensational Methods of Some Preachers in Address to Conference.

Bishop Darlington, in an address to the Methodist conference, in session at Greensboro, the other day, called on the Methodist preachers to keep in mind their mission to preach the gospel without frills and to leave sensational methods alone.

"I crave for the ministry," said the Bishop, "the time when we will preach only of the things that pertain to the kingdom of God. I heard once of a man who announced that he was going to speak on garlic and onions. God have mercy on his shriveled soul. I want to save these young preachers from doing a thing like that."

"I am not going to discuss with you the number of blessings. But these early disciples sought all the blessings they could get."

"Jesus started the disciples out from Jerusalem, an exceedingly hard field, bigotry, moral turpitude, and spiritual deadness."

"Too many of us want good places, and too few of us want to make a bad place good."

"The way to the top, if there is any top, is to do the work well at the bottom."

"We now invite people to the prayer meeting promising just one hour if they will come. The Lord called to a prayer meeting that lasted ten days."

The Bishop's account of his conversion in a little country church, when smitten with conviction he knelt at the altar in prayer where a great peace filled his soul and he rose a new man in Christ Jesus, swept the conference with tides of holy emotion and billows of "amen" rolled up from that great body of itinerants.
