**JACKSON TOWNSHIP WOMAN SAID TO BE 130 YEARS OLD.**

Old Colored "Grannie," Living Near Birthplace of Andy Jackson, Claims to Have Been Born in 1790.

Waxhaw, R. F. D. No. 5, Jan. 26.—Last Saturday, about nightfall, we had a regular old-fashioned January thunder storm, if that's the proper name for it, and the rain came in torrents. The writer knows what he is talking about, for he was wending his way homeward and was caught in it. It has been the topic of conversation for several days past that there had never been such good roads in Union county in the month of January before, and by-the-way, I think the new road board was about to take to itself credit for these good roads. Wonder who will be charged with responsibility for the kind we are going to have in February?

Mr. W. J. Simms, whose misfortune it was to get kicked by his Ford a few days ago, is still nursing the injured member, and has been unable to resume his work as teacher of the Jackson Forest school.

It looks like the census takers are going to have it tough for the remainder of the time required to finish the job. The time should be extended anyhow. The amount of work required to be done in 30 days would be ample for ninety days, and if it is to be as correct as it should be, the whole of the ninety days would be full of work, especially where one enumerator has a territory eight miles square and thickly populated.

We found a few days ago in the round of enumeration an old colored woman who is one hundred and thirty (130) years old, according to the statement of her relatives with whom she makes her home. This old colored "grannie" lives with her great-grand son who is himself 65 years old, and she seems to be in very good health. We, oh learning of her extreme age, and noticing that she seemed to have a number of fairly good teeth, remarked, "you still have teeth, auntie." "Yes sir, I have my third set now," and we wondered if that is not remarkable. This old woman lives near the Jackson birthplace and some day, when we have more time than a census enumerator has while on his rounds, we are going over and have a talk with "old auntie," and see if she can tell us how "Andy" Jackson looked when he cut his first teeth and what were her impressions of him for greatness when she rocked him to sleep in his "box crib."

This has been the busiest moving season in this section that we remember of. Most every one it seems has moved, and when we think of what this breaking up of neighborhood association means it saddens us. There are "new neighbors" where old friends were last year, and we wonder whether we will like 'em or not. There are new children in the school and we wonder whether they are bad children who will help to ruin the few little angels that are stationary; and the new children wonder whether their new associations will be like the old ones, or whether they will be snobbish and mean. In this connection, it's well that children are just children and do not brood over the breaking up like the older ones do, else we would sure have a "blue" old world.—Novus Homo.
