LIME WILL FILL OUR BARN TO THE RAFTERS WITH HAY

County Agent Broom Urges the Use of This Wonderful Soil Fertilization Material, and Tells Why.

To the Editor of The Journal:—
What will lime do for us? In the first place it will fill our barns to the rafters with red clover hay, if we will sow the clover. It will give us larger crops of cowpeas, soybeans, vetch, crimson clover, etc. In fact, lime and acid phosphate are essential to the growth of all leguminous plants. Leguminous plants do not like an acid soil; the truth is many of our leguminous plants, such as alfalfa, red clover, and some others will not thrive at all on sour lands. Our soils are sour. Lime corrects this acidity and makes them sweet. Nitrogen-fixing bacteria will not thrive in sour soils, but they do thrive in a soil that has been made sweet by the application of lime. We sometimes purchase inoculating material for our leguminous seeds and sow these seed on soils that are acid find that the inoculating material is no good. This is because the soil was so sour that the bacteria was killed by the soil acids.

When the soil is sweetened by an application of lime our leguminous plants get their nitrogen from the air of these nitrogen-fixing bacteria. This nitrogen does not cost us anything. We get from fifty to one hundred pounds of nitrogen in this way. When we purchase this in commercial fertilizers we pay fifteen to thirty dollars for it. When we have to apply manure to get clover to grow we do not get the free nitrogen from the air; the plant feeds on the nitrogen in the manure. Manure does not correct acidity, but actually makes an acid soil more sour.

Lime as above stated will fill our barns with hay, and will stop the importation of hay from the farms of the west. It will stop the laborious and pernicious practice of pulling fodder. If the farm is limed systematically, one ton of ground limestone to the acre every four years, and legumes grown in crop rotations, the farm will double in productiveness by the time we get round the third time. We will also find that our fertilizer bills will be limited to the purchase of acid phosphate and lime.

Farmers are now placing their orders for fall delivery. If you intend using lime this fall better place your orders now. The demand for lime is increasing so rapidly that it is impossible to get prompt shipment if we wait until just time to apply it. We want every farmer to get lime for at least two or three acres and demonstrate for himself upon his own land its value. Remember, however, that lime and legumes go together; if you do not want to improve your land through the use of legumes, double your crops, and fill your barns to the rafters with the best of hay twice a year, and reduce your fertilizer bills, lime will not help you much.—T. J. W. Broom.
