CHEROKEE COUNTY SUED

Automobilists Claim Thirteen Thousand Dollar Damages on Account or Bad Road.

Luther Spearman, of Kings Mountain, N. C., has sued Cherokee, South Carolina, in the sum of thirteen thousand dollars for damages sustained to himself, his family and his automobile last August while motoring on a public highway in that county. Mr. Spearman claims that a washout in the road was the cause of his injuries that subsequent investigation showed that the county officials and the highway commissioners had been notified in ample time to have repaired the dangerous place, and that no warning sign or light had been placed at the washout and that was carelessness and neglect on the part of the county and the highway commission that permitted the accident to occur.
