Says Subscription Dances Should Be Prohibited

Although Not Opposed to Dancing, Monroe Minister Thinks Lack of Proper Supervision Should Not By Any Means Be Countenanced

To the Editor of The Journal:— I trust that you will give me space in your valuable paper for an expression of my opinion on the subject of public subscription dances.

I want to say at the outset that I am not opposed to dancing in itself. I was taught to dance in boyhood as I was taught to ride a horse, and I have myself taught my own children the first steps in dancing. My own experience in attending dances and taking part in the dancing has convinced me that there is nothing demoralizing in dancing as dancing, but rather to the contrary that it encourages proper respect and courtesy toward women.

The public dance hall as it exists in the larger cities I have for years regarded as a serious menace unless exceptionally carefully supervised by men and women having the moral welfare of the dancers solely at heart. I would say the same as to dance halls or schools conducted by churches.

Until recently I have known practically nothing of the public subscription dance, which is as I understand it a dance which any man may attend upon payment of a stipulated amount and bring any woman he may select, without his own name or the name of his proposed partner being submitted to any board of chaperons or managers. The whole matter of chaperons does not seem to figure prominently in these dances. It might be called a negligible adjunct of the public subscription dance.

Hence, the important essential of dancing as of any other recreation in which men and women partake together, the essential of proper supervision, is practically disregarded, and it is not surprising that instances

of indiscretions, or even of serious moral lapses, are being heard of in connection with public subscription dances.

I believe it to be the duty of every community to do everything possible to prevent the holding of public subscription dances. Even if there is a long list of well-known chaperons, the fact that the dance is open to the public merely upon payment of the price makes the task of proper supervision difficult and the risk of improper behavior imminent. To my mind there is no assurance of moral safety unless, in addition to the presence of respected chaperons, the participants themselves in the dance are men and women who are personally known to the chaperons or managers, and who have social reputations to sustain.

I feel it my duty to voice my opposition to dancing improperly conducted at the same time that I voice my approval of dancing as a recreation properly conducted. I would oppose a walking party so conducted as to be a moral danger to the participants, or a swimming party, or an automobile ride, in fact any form of recreation in which men and women take part together.

As to certain of the new dance steps, or motions perhaps would be the better word, I think it hardly necessary for me to denounce them, for I believe that already they are falling into the disfavor they deserve in the eyes of all true men and women who enjoy the wholesome recreation of real and proper dancing within reasonable hours and with proper supervision as to participants and conduct.

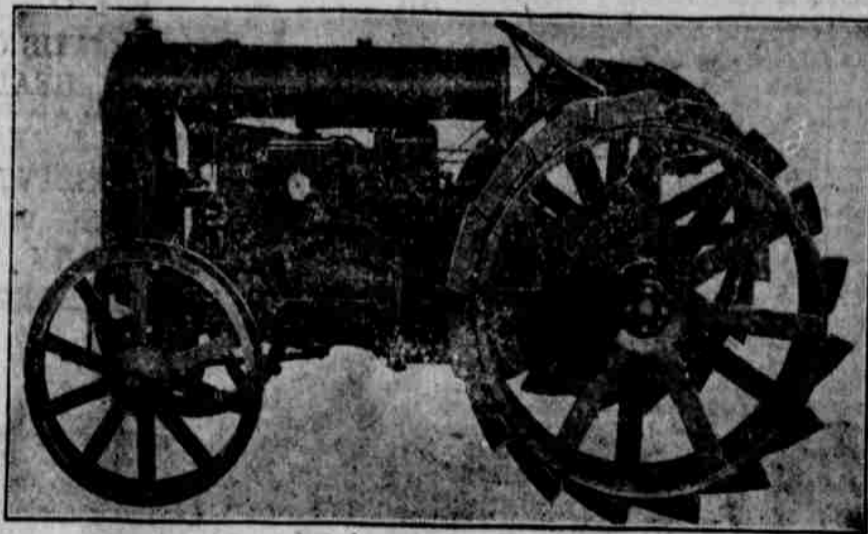
