PANACEA FOR LABOR TROUBLES A Danville, Va., dispatch of Nov. 25th says:

"Wages of 6.000 employes of the Schoolfield plant of the Dan River cotion mills will be out 25 per cent effective Monday. The reduction was approved by the employees' leg-islature when the senate branch last concurred with the lower

This dispatch is a refutation of the century-old assertion that though employees are ready to share in the profits of their employer they would be disinclined to accept a reduction in wages in times of business depres-The affairs of the Dan River mills are conducted on a basis similar to that of Congress, representalives of the employes sitting in legislative and semitorial conferences I which policies and wages are deter mines, while the owners of the mili exercise the prerogatives of the President, which include the veto power. Stimulated by the offer of a share in the profits for increased production, the employes of this mill, according to report, have weeded out the in-competent workers, and reduced overhead charges by exercising better care of the equipment. That the plan has been entirely successiful has been reflected in the large dividends paid by the milt previous to the time the readjustment of prices to a pre-war revel set in; and that the employees intend doing the right thing by their employees during times of adversity is shown by the above dispatch. is very improbable that the Dan River mills will ever have labor difficulties and manufacturers, we feel sure, will find their plan worth investiga-
