S. C. NEGROES BACK. They Were Lured to Liberia 23 Years Ago. Lured to Liberia through seductive tales of an easy pleasant existence, a family of South Carolina negroes returned to the United States last Thursday after a twenty-three year sojourn in Africa. Annie Wheeler, female head of the family, arrived at Norfolk today on the British steamer Skegness from Dakar. Numerous circulars which pictured in glowing terms the high wages which were being paid in the coal and gold mines of the country was the cause of their migration, according to Annie Wheeler. "There were gold mines there alright," she said, "but they wouldn't let us work in them, and so we took on washing. We remained in Liberia only a year," said the woman, "and then went to Sierra Leone. "We have been trying to get back to the United States ever since."
