 Eclips lying upon the ground, apparently mortally wounded. He fired twice, he said, at the prostrate forms of the two men, but was unable to say whether or not his aim was good. One shot, he is certain, went wild.

Seegars Congratulates Them

Leaving the men for dead, Boyd said he and Lincoln hastened back to the woods. By slow degrees, dodging all roads, they made their way back to the home of Seegars, who promptly ordered them to go into a stretch of woods in the rear of his home, saying he feared that the officers might discover them if they stayed about the house. When told of the success of their plan, Boyd said that Seegars shook their hands, congratulating them as follows: "Boys, you have made a good job of it."

Boyd said they remained in the woods near Seegars' home the remainder of the day. Food, he said, was sent to them from the house. During the day, while discussing the killing, Boyd said Lincoln remarked that Will lost his nerve, but I had them at my mercy, falling right and left. To this gruesome story, Seegars replied: "I know you'd do it, I know your daddy."

That night Boyd said he and Lincoln walked to Monroe, getting here about eleven o'clock. He stated that he spent the rest of the night at Lincoln's home.

Wanted Boyd to Go to Winston-Salem

Lincoln and Boyd were positively identified here today as the murderers of his brothers by Laney Funderburk. Another negro by the name of Clark, who married a kinswoman of Steve Seegars, was also among those examined. His evidence is of a damaging nature. He claims that Seegars tried to induce him to commit the dastardly deed, and also declared that Lincoln was taken to a negro church the Sunday previous to the killing for the purpose of being shown Ganson Funderburk so that he would get the right man.

Steve Seegars and two of his boys, one of whom Boyd claims arranged the killings, and the other who drove them to the Funderburk neighborhood, are in jail at Chesterfield.

Boyd said Seegars wanted him to go to Winston-Salem. Lincoln, he thought, would evade suspicion by remaining at Monroe, he said.
