Sixty thousand thrifty New England farmers left the United States the past year and settled in Canada. They went because they were offered better homes. They went because they were being badly imposed upon by this beneficent Government of ours. An average of two hundred per cent more is charged for every American made agricultural implement in this country than is charged for the same implement in Canada. Three hundred per cent more is charged on articles of clothing and things of general use. They cross the border, and pay much less for what they buy, and sell their products for just the same. This aptly illustrates this infamous robber system in this country. Sixty thousand good citizens, productive citizens, are driven from our country in one year to seek relief from a species of legal thievery perpetrated and made possible by a beneficent government.

We do not understand the law in detail, but if our surmise is correct Virginia has one that should commend itself to all fair minded citizens. The law permits the nearest surviving relative of a murdered man to attach the estate of the murderer and hold it. This is some little reparation for what the family suffer and is a wise provision, but we could not hope for any such law in North Carolina unless it was agreed to give to the attorney who defended the murderer fifty per cent of the amount attached. Oh yes, we look after our lawyers, and incidentally they look after the murderers.

No one need give themselves any concern as to how Virginia will handle the Allens, once she catches them. She has a difficult problem in catching them, but once she does catch them and lands them safely in jail, the ballance will be attended to with neatness and dispatch. Virginia does not seem to have a way of creating "Noble Roman" by making it possible to turn loose a lot of the worst murderers on the State, as the price.

There are some men publishing weekly newspaper whose idea of the value of advertising space corresponds much to that of an inexperienced boy. They take the blanket sheet system and make it at that.

Possibly so, if his case was in North Carolina, where an imbecil jury in a murder case is always at a premium, but not so in the Old Dominion where the jury some times go out and pray for Gods guidance in their verdict, and at all times strives to uphold the law instead of some legal shyster.

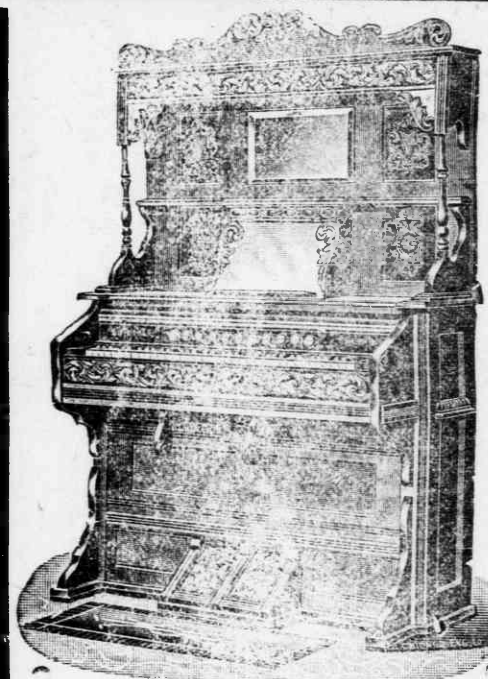
