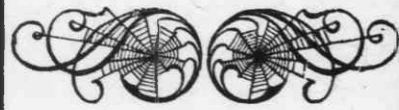

### Bodies Will Never Rise.

"The bodies of the victims of the Titanic disaster are at the bottom of the deep never to leave it," declared Prof. Robert W. Wood of the Chair of Experimental Physics of Johns Hopkins University.

"It is altogether improbable that any of the corpses will ever return to the surface of the water as is the case with bodies drowned in shallow water.

"At the depth of two miles the pressure of the water is something like 6,000 pounds to the square inch which is far too great to be overcome by buoyancy ordinarily given drowned bodies by the gases that are generated in time."

The managing director of the Wolin Davit and Engineering Company has issued a statement that the Titanic carried 14 life boats and two cutters with an aggregate capacity of 9,702 cubic feet, but was equipped with davits capable of handling double or triple the number of boats carried. The owners adopted this plan, he says, because it was rumored that changes were to be made in the near future of the official regulations which would compel carrying of more boats. He concluded: "Additional boats for the accomodation of every soul on board might have been installed practically in a single day."

### A State of Vast Opportunity for the Homeseeker.

The 48,508 square miles comprising the area of the State of North Carolina from a prosperous and growing section of vast present wealth and even greater possibilities for the future. **Reinforced Concrete of Old Rome.**  
Although concrete has been used for many centuries, it is generally supposed that reinforced concrete is a modern invention. This, however, has been disproved, according to Popular Mechanics by the finding of bronze reinforcing rods in the concrete roof of an ancient Roman tomb, and in the discovery of reinforced concrete in the construction of one of the walls of the old palace of the Louvre, Paris. The reinforced concrete in the latter dates back only 300 or 400 years, but created much comment because the walls were thought to consist entirely of ashlar and quarry stone. The discovery that the stone casing concealed a core composed in part of reinforced concrete was made while workmen were placing the wall for an elevator installation.

### Sufficient Liteboats In Future.

J. Bruce Ismay, president of the International Mercantile Marine, announced Saturday that he had given instructions to all the lines of the International Mercantile Marine, which include the White Star, the American, the Red Star, the Leyland, the Atlantic Transport and the Dominion lines, to equip all steamers with sufficient lifeboats and rafts for every passenger and every member of the crew without regard to regulations prescribed by the governments of the United States, Great Britain, Belgium or any of these countries to which the steamers belong.

### The Titanics roll of Passengers.

The printed rolls of first and second cabins, of the Titanic compared with the list of survivors on the Carpathia, show that of 390 first cabin passengers 212 were saved, 154 of them women and children; and that of 270 second cabin passengers 116 were saved 102 of them women and children. Of the third class passengers, 800 in number, 170 survive, of whom 83 are women and children.

Of 985 officers and crew, 207, including 22 women, reached the Carpathia. A few in each class doubtless escaped enumeration on the Carpathia.

Accepting the estimate of the Carpathia's officers, that 705 survivors reached the ship, comparison with the total, 2,181 showed that 1,476 are unaccounted for.

### Staining Glass.

The art of colored glass has been lost and refound, guarded and stolen so many times during the history of civilization that it seems almost impossible to say anything new on glass staining. Yet a process has been discovered for making the stained glass used in windows which is a departure from anything known to the old timers. The glass first receives its design in mineral colors, and the whole is then fired in a heat so intense that the coloring matter and the glass are indissolubly fused. The most attractive feature of this method is that the surface acquires a peculiar pebbled character in the heat, so that when the glass is in place the lights are beautifully soft and mellow.
