FOR DISINFECTION OF BOOKS

Apparatus Devised by a Frenchman Removes Danger of Contagion and Doesn't Damage Paper.

The danger from contagion from books that have been in the hands of persons suffering from yarious diseases has led to the invention of various methods of disinfection, of which none appears to be more effec-Marsoulan of Paris.

His process embraces two parts.
