Again the Mexican question becomes acute, the sympathizers of Carranza are endeavoring to smuggle arms and ammunition. Huerta is opposing their entry and is trying to blockade Tampico. Uncle Sam considers this a personal grievance and will endeavor to check by force any attempt to interfere with Mr. Carranza's friends. This would seem a *casus-beli*. There is a growing sentiment that there is entirely too much intimacy and friendship between Mr. W. J. Bryan and the Vila crowd. If it was the purpose of the United States to uphold the hands of Carranza and his murderous gang then it was in poor taste to have invited the South America meditators to have come here to try to adjust the difference in that sorely distressed country, Mexico. Perhaps the matter may be straightened out without war, but if its necessary to protect rebels interest then we do not think the United States will be wanting in a disposition to do it. That ardent desire to avoid war has led the United States in an unenviable attitude. A firm hand guided by intelligence and prudence with fairness to all contending factions in Mexico could have brought peace to the troubled land.

It seems that the Militant suffragist are terrorizing the people of the British Island in wanton and malicious destruction of property that has no purpose and exhibits no spirit save that of malignancy. The world condemns England for her pacific policy in dealing with these arson fiends. If England had begun the policy of deportation two years ago it would have long since palsied the hands that swept that accursed land with a torch. If anything should have demonstrated woman's unfitness to vote, then her wild, reckless wicked use of fire and other means of personal property destruction would have done so. No principle in any civilized country has ever been fought for upon such a low mean, contemptible bases. It matters not what women ever wins who are fighting in the militants she can never win the respect and sympathy of respectfully people of this or any other country.

The Mebane people took up the matter of a Fourth of July celebration in a public meeting last Friday night, and while sentiment differed as to how we should celebrate it, there seemed to be very generally conceded that some method of observing the day would be well for Mebane, and after discussing at some length as to what was best to do, a committee of three was appointed to ascertain if the necessary funds could be raised to carry out a program. These men were appointed and next morning in a short while had raised more than two hundred dollars, and seemed to think there would be no trouble in raising the necessary funds. Mebane has made an enviable reputation in observing the

Fourth of July, and she determined to maintain that reputation. We hope by next issue to be able to give more definite information in regard as to what is expected to be done on that day.

The Reformed Presbyterians have made rigid laws regarding the use of tobacco, refusing to license ministers, elders, deacons or to appoint Sunday school teachers or pupils who use tobacco. The Presbyterian and Methodist have both adopted similar rules, regarding their ministers. There is no doubt that such ruling will in time have a good effect on male members of their churches in discouraging the use of the golden weed, however it is simply a luxurious habit and is disputed whether it really does the temperate user any harm or not. Of course this has no reference to the impolite and selfish fellow who chews and spits on all occasions, as these are few. There are other objectionable practices, to say the least, by elders, deacons and the like, the synods might get after, which cause misery to others to a great extent. Intemperance can be practiced in anything and while they are making rules why not make a clean sweep in all directions.
