Capital Punishment

The Governor of Tennessee believes in capital punishment and has vetoed a bill that would abolish the death penalty in his state.

We believe he has acted correctly. Many more desperate criminals would be willing to take chances if they knew their lives would not be at stake. Beside there are some crimes that we can imagine no other punishment would fit save death. The nameless crime, for instance. To abolish the death penalty for this would undoubtedly nurture lynch law, and the worst part of mob violence is not so much punishment of the victim, but the opportunity it affords for anarchy.

Capital punishment is a deterrent. Some people assert that it is not; that a felon thinks little of it and a criminal would as soon die as go to prison for life. There are many things in contradiction of this. One of the strongest is how the man sentenced to death strives to have his sentence commuted to life imprisonment. —Wilmington Dispatch.
