

A bill providing for Federal aid in the construction of improved public highways was introduced by Senator Simmons. The bill carries an apropriation of \$100,000 to be expended under the direction of the Secretary of Agriculture in conjunction with the Postmaster genebe selected by them over which ru ral letter carriers travel.
