Our Washington Letter.

Poor President Harrison. The New York gang have made his life a torment for the last week. They have figuratively jumped on him and wiped up the floor with him. They have pulled him this way, that way and the other way all at the same time.

A delegation of Ohio republicans went to the White House on Saturday and read the riot act to Mr. Harrison, and told him that the Buckeye State was bound to go democratic at the coming State election if he did not give her more recognition in the distribution of the offices.

When the Senate adjourned last week Mr. Harrison thought he would get rid of some of the most persistent of the office seekers, but he was sadly mistaken. Since then a large number of republican Senators have almost lived in the White House.

During the recent campaign we heard a great deal of talk about the republican party being the people's party. Now let's see how the people are treated. Orders have just been issued by Secretaries Blaine, Proctor and Tracy defining the hours during which they may be seen. The people are given one hour, from 12 to 1 o'clock, four days in the week, during which they may call on these high and mighty officers.

around in republican circles that Harrison does not propose to fill the two vacancies on the Civil Service Commission. That would be almost equivalent to abolishing the whole thing, as the one Commissioner now in office can do little else except draw his salary. The negroes of the South who have come here to get Federal offices are very much discouraged. I overheard a conversation between two of them from Louisiana, in a hotel lobby. One of them said: "I am going back home, you may let Pitt Kellogg fool you into believing he can get you something, but after what Harrison said to us to-day, I consider the jig is up."

Mr. Higgins, the new republican Senator from Delaware, seems to be almost as much of a political hustler as his eminent democratic namesake from Maryland. The new pension officials are beginning early. Already one decision of ex-Commissioner Black's has been overruled that will reopen thousands of cases heretofore decided adversely.

Another big count must be made when Assistant Treasurer Roberts takes charge of the sub-treasury at New York. There are \$185,000,000 stored there which must be counted, but, as the money there is chiefly in gold coin, the operation will be less tedious. It can all be done in about five weeks.

Our Teachers.

The sixth session of the North Carolina Teachers' Assembly will be opened in their hall in Morehead City on June 18th and it is expected that Senator Z. B. Vance will deliver an address to the body on June 19th. MONEY IN THE VAULTS.

It Must Be Counted and Will Take Quite a While to Do It. WASHINGTON, April 9.—All the money in the United States Treasury must be counted when Treasurer Hyatt goes out and Treasurer Huston comes in. There is about \$194,000,000 of it of which \$150,000,000 is in silver and \$25,000,000 is gold coin, the remainder being paper money. Besides this there is about \$283,000,000 in new United States notes and gold, and silver certificates which has never been issued, but must be counted, and about \$218,000,000 worth of bonds belonging to national banks, and trust funds which must be accounted for.

The \$150,000,000 of silver is contained in 150,000 canvas bags, each containing \$1,000 and weighs about 56 pounds, the whole weighing about 4,000 tons. And there will be extra work this time because \$80,000 of this silver money is in the new vault which was so damp that Treasury officials were afraid to leave it in the bags alone, and they had 40,000 boxes made, into each of which they put two of the canvas bags of dollars. These boxes must all be opened, the bags taken out and weighed, and then boxed up again.
