Mr. Prather was in town when the fire was discovered, and by the time he reached his home, nothing was left but the smoldering ruins. The fire was first discovered on the roof of the L, near the chimney, but those who saw it were some distance away and before they reached the scene of the fire the flames had gotten too much headway for any effort on their part to avail anything. So there was nothing to do but look on and see everything burn up.

Mr. Prather said to us the evening after the fire that he saved nothing except what he had on his back. The loss on building, household and kitchen furniture, etc., is estimated by Mr. Prather at about two thousand dollars; the insurance is one thousand. We are very sorry for our friend, but hope he will soon rebuild his home.

Easter Sunday at Central Methodist Church.

All the exercises at this church on Sunday were of a very interesting character. Busy hands had been at work all Saturday afternoon decorating the church with evergreen and flowers, and at 11 o'clock service Sunday morning Dr. Barnett preached a very fine sermon, appropriate to the occasion, to the largest congregation ever assembled in the new church—the aisles and other space being filled with chairs. At 3:30 P. M., there was quite a large number of parents and friends of the Sunday School present, it being "Parents' Day." No special services were held, only the usual Sunday School work gone through in the regular order. This was done that the parents might see the workings of the school and the manner in which it is conducted, and also the way their children are being taught. All expressed themselves as highly pleased. The school is now in the most prosperous condition since its existence. The children of all sizes acquitted themselves handsomely, not a hitch or blunder occurred, but everything passed off to the entire satisfaction of the large audience, and it was the common remark that this was the best entertainment of the kind ever given in Mount Airy, and much credit is due the ladies in charge for the admirable training of the children and the good management throughout. 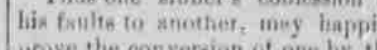
Again, he who has injured another, should confess his fault to that other as well as to God, and beg forgiveness from both.

THREE TICKETS IN NORTH CAROLINA.
