MYSTERIOUS WARNING.

Omens That Foretell to Englishmen Deaths of Royalties.

A grewsome story comes from London of the appearance of the "phantom barge" on the Thames for three successive nights preceding the death of the queen. This phan-tom barge is believed by the water. men of the Thames to appear when a member of the Royal family is about to die, just as the celebrated "white lady of the Hohenzollerna" gives warning of the death of a monarch of that family. And when this phantom barge appears gliding thro' the lowly shadows and night mists of the river the great clock of Westminster, Big Ben, gives 13 strokes at midnight instead of his ordinary dozen. Just now any number of Thames watermen can be found who say they have seen the phantom barge and heard Big Ben strike his ominons number.

There are well authenticated instances of Big Ben having struck 13 at midnight. Once a soldier on sentry duty at Windsor was charged with having slept on post and was sentenced to be shot. It was charged that he was asleep there at midnight of a certain night. His defence was Big Ben had struck 13 and had been heard in Windsor. The man was pardoned. This is a recorded case, but the record does not say that any estastrophe happened to the royal family the next day.

It is said that the phantom barge appeared on the Thames at midnight and Big Ben struck 13 on the night before the death of the prince consort, and that the same things happened the night preceding the death of the Princess Alice and of the Duke of Clarence.
