**The Workings of Suicidal Sentiment.**

When McCue was hanged; when Henry Beattie was electrocuted; when Floyd and Claude Allen were sentenced to death, the people of Virginia felt that in this commonwealth at least the laws against murder could be enforced.

Where is that pride today? How do the citizens, who followed with keenest interest and deepest feeling, the efforts of the detectives to track down and take these brutal and red-handed murderers—Sidna Allen and Wesley Edwards—now feel when they see the two arch conspirators, the two cruelest assassins of all, stand with sentences only a little more severe than those given to Friel Allen and Sidna Edwards?

A more glaring, shocking and repulsive crime than the annihilation of a whole court has never darkened the pages of this or any other commonwealth. The first impulse of Virginia was to reestablish the laws of this state at all costs and at all hazards—and this impulse was not based on any weak or unworthy desire for vengeance. It was the natural and inevitable course for any community to pursue that wished to preserve its life and usefulness.

All over Virginia there are homes from which the fairest members were swept by death during the war. And no depth of grief ever shook the belief of the Virginians that it was expedient that some should perish for all. And yet today, with the appalling and atrocious murder of Judge Massie, Commonwealth's Attorney Foster, Sheriff Webb, Junior Fowler, and Miss Ayers, and with the absolute proof that the bullets were fired by Floyd Allen, Claude Allen, Sidna Allen and Wesley Edwards, as the part of a pre-conceived and pre-determined and cruel conspiracy, the commonwealth has been unable to mete out to S. H. Allen and Wesley Edwards the doom they most richly deserve. Here we see the workings of suicidal sentiment. Here we behold in all its glory the practice of enforcing the laws by hysterical petitions. Here we see the power of money in breaking down and subverting the very basis of civil life.

Doubtless the success of the Allen sympathizers in saving the precious necks of Sidna Allen and Wesley Edwards will greatly add to the demand that Claude and Floyd Allen be spared. Sentimentality has had great influence in preventing the courts and juries of this state from dealing out their just deserts to Sidna Allen and Wesley Edwards. Now, let us see what sentiment can do with the governor of this state!
