Proceeding of the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy October 10th 1919.

Mount Airy, N. C. Oct. 10th 1919.

The Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy met at the Mayor's office at 8:00 o'clock P. M. as per recess October 7th 1919, all members present in the person of H. M. Foy, J. W. Lovell, C. A. Shelton, A. G. Bowman, B. Beasley, Mayor E. C. Bivens, presiding.

The following ordinance was offered and on motion of A. G. Bowman, seconded by J. W. Lovell, the motion carried as follows:

North Carolina, Surry County, The Town of Mount Airy.

Whereas, The Town of Mount Airy is indebted to Wachovia Bank & Trust Company in the sum of Ten Thousand Dollars, to A. Goldsmith in the sum of Four Thousand Dollars for moneys heretofore borrowed in order to pay and meet the expenses in improving the streets of the Town of Mount Airy, and other necessary expenses incurred by the Town of Mount Airy from time to time for necessary public expenditures; and whereas, the Town of Mount Airy is indebted to T. G. Fawcett in the sum of Thirty-One Hundred Ninety-Three Dollars for lands purchased on which to build and erect a Town Hall heretofore authorized by the Board of Commissioners and declared to be a public necessity, and also indebted to First National Bank of Mount Airy in the sum of Eighty-Five Hundred Dollars; and whereas, the Town of Mount Airy finds it necessary to issue bonds to meet the aforesaid expenses and pay off and discharge the indebtedness before mentioned.

Now, therefore, Be It Ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy:

1st: That the Town of Mount Airy do issue its bonds in denominations of Five Thousand Dollars or One Thousand Dollars each, to an amount not exceeding Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars, such bonds to bear a rate of interest not exceeding five and one-half per cent, payable semi-annually, such bonds to bear date of the first day of October 1919, and to be payable as follows:

\$1000.00 in three years, \$1000.00 in four years, \$1000.00 in five years, \$1000.00 in six years, \$1000.00 in seven years, \$2000.00 in eight years, \$2000.00 in nine years, \$2000.00 in ten years, \$2000.00 in eleven years, \$2000.00 in twelve years, \$2000.00 in thirteen years, \$2000.00 in fourteen years, \$2000.00 in fifteen years, \$2000.00 in sixteen years, \$2000.00 in seventeen years.

The funds to be derived from the sale of such bonds to be applied exclusively to the debts hereinafter mentioned.

2nd: That said bonds be sold after advertisement as provided by law, and the same upon receipt of the proceeds to be delivered to the purchasers; provided however said bonds shall not be sold for less than par and accrued interest.

3rd: That the aforesaid bonds shall be signed in the name of the Town of Mount Airy by its Mayor and attested by the Secretary and Treasurer, and the corporate seal of the Town of Mount Airy thereon affixed. The interest to be evidenced by coupons bearing the lithographed signature of the Mayor, and when said bonds and coupons are executed as aforesaid and delivered to the purchaser, the same shall constitute a binding and valid obligation of the Town of Mount Airy, to the payment of which the faith, credit and property of the Town of Mount Airy shall be irrevocably pledged.

4th: It is hereby recited and set forth that the bonds authorized to be issued by these ordinances and issued for the purpose of raising funds with which to pay off and discharge necessary obligations of the Town of Mount Airy made and incurred in the necessary expenses of the Town.

5th: That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds has been levied and shall be annually levied and collected as other taxes.

6th: That a statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the Clerk pursuant to Chapter No. 178 Public Laws of 1919, and is open to public inspection.

7th: That the average assessed valuation of property subject to taxation by the Town of Mount Airy for the 3 fiscal years in which taxes were levied as shown by the aforesaid statement is \$2,647,761.00, and the amount of the net debt of the Town of Mount Airy outstanding authorized and to be authorized as shown by said statement is \$301,297.00.

8th: That the aforesaid ordinances shall take effect from and after its passage and shall not be submitted for vote.

Passed and ordained, this 10th day of October, 1919.

The foregoing Ordinance was passed and ordained by the Board of Commissioners on the 10th of October 1919, and by virtue of the authority vested in the Board of Commissioners, bids were received by the Board on the 3rd day of December, 1919, and the bonds have been awarded to John Nuveen & Co. of Chicago, Ill. and any persons desiring to protest against the validity of the said bonds, or to bring any action to determine the validity, are notified that they are to commence said action within thirty days from the date of this notice and before the delivery of said bonds.
