Fertilizers Should Not Be Used as Substitute

Pertilizers should be employed in addition to and not in place of other good sell-management practices," says Prof. A. T. Wiancke of the Purdue experiment station. "Legumes in the sotation, the use of manure or other organic matter, drainage and liming ere needed are all perquisites to the most satisfactory use of fertiliz-

Results of a long-time experiment on a corn-wheat-clover rotation at the Purdue station illustrates this point. The treatment and results were as

Plot 1-Limed 1912 and 1920, glx tons manure on corn crop, 19.2 bushels wheat per acre.

wheat per acre.

Plot 2—Same as plot 1 with 200 pounds per acre acid phosphate on corn crop, 20.5 bushels wheat per acre.

Plot 8—Same as plot 2 with 200 pounds per acre 2-8-4 on wheat crop, 28.7 bushels wheat per acre.

The significant thing about these results is that in plot 8, the combination of a good rotation, legumes, time and manure produced conditions resulting in large returns from the use

sulting in large returns from the use of a suitable complete fertilizer. In other words, as shown by plot 1, the rotation, legumes, lime and manure produced a favorable condition but, pared to the others a small crop. addition of complete fertilizer on plot 8 was all that was needed to the crop into a new field of

Extensive Experiments

With Apples for Swine With Apples for Swine
The Washington State college has
found that cull apples are worth \$19
a ton as hog feed. Extensive experiments were conducted the past year.
Figs which weighed 94.8 pounds each
of the start of the experiment gained
in weight 65.1 pounds each, or an avmage of 1.36 pounds per day. Each
pig was fed an average of 4.22 pounds
of apples and 4.17 pounds of grain per
day. It was found that the apples
saved, per every 100 pounds of gain,
4.00 pounds of tankage, 31.7 pounds
of milirun and 94.42 pounds of hariay.
To do this, 296.6 pounds of apples were
fed. As the apples are bulky, containing little protein, it is necessary to ining little protein, it is necessary to inde a little more tankage in the grain
