

#### THE HEAVY TAX ON TOBACCO

Uncle Sam Collects Five Time As Much As The Grower Gets For His Crop

The government of the United States takes in revenue from the bright tobacco grown by the farmers of Virginia and the Carolinas five times as much as they receive for their product.

To prove the truth of this state ment regarding the revenue paid the United States government during the year from January 1, 1923, to December 31, 1923, it is conservatively estimated that the output of cigarettes in the United States covering this period was sixty-five billion, these cigarettes not weighing more than three pounds per thousand, for which the government collects a tax of three dollars per thousand.
