**LIGHTNING SETS OFF DYNAMITE—SIX DEAD**

**Men Seek Shelter in Office Where Dynamite Was—Lightning Hits Place—Men Are Dead**

Winston-Salem, June 25.—Six men were almost instantly killed, seven miles south of the city during an electric storm which passed over this section yesterday afternoon about 4 o'clock. The men had been operating the rock quarry owned by Samuel Miller, and when the storm approached they sought refuge under shelter of the quarry office, and in which was stored a quantity of dynamite used in blasting the stone.

The dead are Samuel Miller, owner of the quarry, George Miller, Charles Miller, Julius Miller, Clark Spough, Isaac Clemmons, and Bob Wagner, negro.

Charles and Julius Miller are brothers. Samuel Miller, who owned and operated the quarry, was their nephew.

During the storm lightning struck a tree in close proximity to the office. Either by reaching the barn before the bolt was grounded, or from concussion caused by the stroke, the dynamite was exploded. The men were thrown some distance from the building, which was fired. The fatal bolt and its disastrous effect were observed by parties from a distance, and when they reached the scene it was found that all but Samuel Miller were dead. He lived until the ambulance arrived from the city, but died in a few minutes after. The bodies were badly mangled and burned, the office was destroyed and their automobiles, which were parked nearby, were also badly wrecked and everything that was inflammable about it was burned.

The men were evidently standing well under the shelter with their backs against the wall at the time the tragedy occurred. The mutilation of the bodies was principally in the backs of the victims. They were badly crushed as if by the force of the timbers. The backs of the heads were badly crushed and their legs broken.

**TOWN ORDINANCE**

Be it ordained by the board of commissioners of the town of Mount Airy in regular session this day held at the Town Hall in Mount Airy, N. C.:

1. That the owners of real estate within the boundaries hereinafter set out be and they are hereby required and directed to curb and pave the sidewalks, on both sides of said street where the same has not already been done as herein directed, and of the widths hereinafter set out, as the same runs in front of their respective lots, such paving to be Granolithic, of the grade to be directed by the Street Foreman, and of the widths hereinafter mentioned.

2. That this ordinance shall apply to Kerner Street, from its intersection with Main Street to its terminus. That the widths of the sidewalk shall be at least five feet.

3. That the real estate owners shall conform with the grade established by the Board of Commissioners as indicated by the curbing to be placed thereon.

4. That the cost of this work shall be paid by the several real estate owners, according to the lineal feet frontage of their respective lots, except the sum of 20c per lineal foot of curbing, which shall be paid by the Town of Mount Airy, provided the Town of Mount Airy shall do the necessary grading and set the curbing.

5. That if any real estate owners shall fail for thirty days thereafter ten days notice to do such paving and curbing, that the same shall be done by the Town of Mount Airy, and the cost shall be charged against the delinquent as provided for in Chapter 423 in the Private Laws of the Legislature of 1899, entitled, "An act to Amend the Charter of the Town of Mount Airy" and also in Chapter of the Private Laws of the Legislature of 1911, entitled, "An act to amend the Charter of the Town of Mount Airy."

6. That the twenty cents per lineal foot for the curbing to be paid by the Town shall not be paid until after the sidewalk has been completed.

7. That the material to be used and the proportion in which it shall be used shall be the same as is set out in Section 31 of Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of the Town of Mount Airy adopted by the Board of Commissioners May 1st 1909, and that all work shall be done subject to the inspection of the Street Commissioners and Civil Engineer.
