TAX LISTING TO BE ON A BROADER SCALE

Complete Farm Census in Addition to Usual Listing of Property Will Be Taken

Raleigh, May 2.—Tax listing in North Carolina this year will be on the most comprehensive scale yet undertaken in this state, under a new law which requires a complete farm census in addition to the usual listing of real estate, personal property and poll for taxation.

Listing is scheduled to start on the Tuesday following the first Monday in May and will continue for two months or as long as it becomes necessary to follow out instructions in getting the complete farm census.

Taking of the farm census will require listers in every township and city to exact from farmers practically all the information he knows concerning the ownership and operation of his farm. He must show how many acres owned, number of tenants, if any, amount of land tilled by owner and tenants, acres untilled, open, wooded and pasture land, number of acres planted in cotton, tobacco, corn, wheat and grains for sale or use as feed, clover and other forms of hay, Irish potatoes, sweet potatoes, berries, melons. Each farmer must also give in the number of peach trees, amount of commercial fertilizer used in 1924, number of breeding sows, laying hens and milk cows,

Notice Water, Light and Power System Bonds
Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Mount Airy, N. C.
1. Bonds of the Town of Mount Airy shall be issued for the purpose of constructing additions to the Town's Water Light and Power System.
2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of the bonds shall be \$15,000.
3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of the bonds shall be annually levied and collected.
4. A statement of the debt of the town has been filed with the clerk and is open to public inspection.
5. This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act and in such event it shall take effect when approved by voters of the town at an election as provided in said Act.
The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 28th day of April, 1925, and was first published on the 30th day of April, 1925.
Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within 30 days of its first publication.
