COMPARISON OF RATES OF SOUTHERN PUBLIC UTILITIES CO. AND PRESENT CITY RATES

With the sale of the city power plants and electric system, should the same meet the approval of the voters at the coming election, the subject of rates has become an interesting question. The Southern Power Co., and its subsidiary, the Southern Public Utilities Co., are under control of the Corporation Commission as far as the matter of rates to be charged are concerned, but officials of the company state that in the past fifteen years the company has made voluntary reductions from time to time until now the present rate obtains. As an illustration the present lighting rate is eight cents per kilo-watt, when a few years ago it was as high as 15 cents. These reductions have been voluntary on the part of the company and have come about from the large amount of current that is being generated and distributed.

For lighting purposes the city now charges eight cents per kilo-watt, with a minimum charge of \$1.20 per month. The power company also charges eight cents but the minimum charge is \$1.00, and for all amounts over 25 kilo-watts there is a reduced scale going as low as 2.8 cents.
