

Swain County Newspaper Says Page Isn't Highway Commissioner

Raleigh, Dec. 12.—Denial of the authority of State Highway Commissioner Frank Page to act for the State Highway Commission in approving selection of routes for road is made in the brief of J. E. Coburn, Swain county taxpayer, who is protesting against the completion of an improved road in Fornay's Creek township in the mountain county.

The Swain County Road situation comes up this week for review by the Supreme Court in an appeal by Mr. Coburn, who secured an injunction against further construction of the road until the route should be approved by the State Highway Commission of North Carolina.

Last December Commissioner Page wrote the secretary of the highway commission of Fornay's Creek township that "I have had this location investigated in the North Carolina side, and this letter is to state to you our approval of this location and so far as we are concerned the location is satisfactory."

Upon the authority of this letter the injunction against further construction was dissolved, but Mr. Coburn says it violated the court decree, which stated that the injunction should continue until approval by the State Highway Commission, and that Mr. Page is not the State Highway Commission and has never pretended to be.

Mr. C. W. Blacett visited relatives here Sunday.

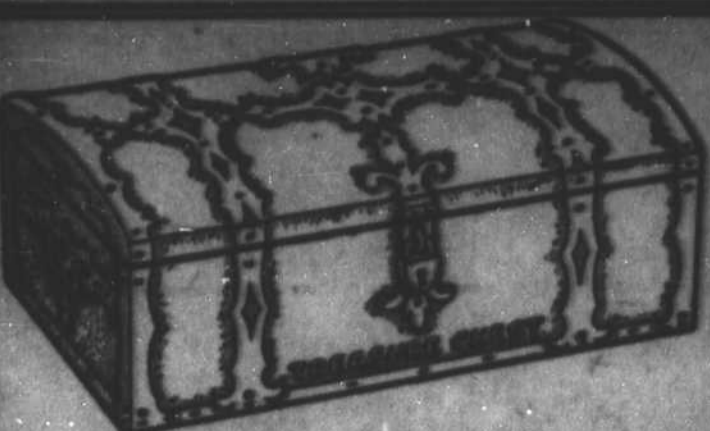

Stokes Controversy To Go Before Jury

Greensboro, Dec. 12.—A contest between the board of education of Stokes county and the county commissioners of that county will go to a jury, Judge Schenck, in Guilford Superior court, decided yesterday and the case is set for the first day of the next term of civil court in Stokes county. The Board of Education came here seeking a mandamus to compel the commissioners to borrow \$20,000 for school building purposes. Counsel for the defense contended that the matter was for a jury, an issue of fact and Judge Schenck sustained the motion.

It was admitted that the county board agreed to borrow the money, but one of the members said that he voted for the borrowing under a misapprehension and as it was by a majority of one that the motion to borrow was passed, the motion was rendered invalid, in the opinion of the county commissioners.
