Register for the Election

The registration books for the election to vote upon the sale of the power system are now open in each of the wards. The books for Ward No. 1 can be found at The News office during the week days except Saturday, when they will be kept at the voting place—the city fire department room. The book for Ward No. 2 is in the hands of T. B. Ashby and are kept open at the office of Poore & Ashby Insurance Agency, in the Galloway building, and will be at the voting place in that ward on Saturdays—the Granite City Motor Co.

The books will close on Saturday Jan. 24th. The law requires that the sale shall be approved by a majority of the registered voters, thus if any one who registers fails to vote it counts against the proposition. The line between the two wards is as follows: Up Franklin street to Main, down Main to Cherry, down Cherry to the Ararat river. All living on the North side of this line are in Ward No. 1, those below are in Ward No. 2.

Before the Recorder

In the Recorder's Court Monday Judge Lowdlyn fined Carlin Lyons of Lumburg \$50 and the cost for driving a truck while under the influence of liquor and gave him a suspended sentence of six months in jail. He is not to drive a car for pleasure within the next two years.

Mrs. Rosa Vakoline was convicted of being a nuisance to her neighbors and given a jail sentence of four months suspended if she moves from where she now resides on Pine Hill. She appealed to Dobson court.

Jim Greenwood found himself in a multitude of troubles. He was bound to Dobson court on the charge of breaking into Dixie McCreary's store several weeks ago. He was also convicted and sent to the roads for six months for retailing, appealing this case to Dobson also.

For being drunk and disorderly Clarence Tatum was taxed with the cost and Will Lankford was fined \$15.

W. P. Thomas was declared not guilty of reckless driving and assault. This case grew out of an accident near Bannertown when Mr. Thomas' car struck a child as it was walking up the road. The child sustained an injured ankle but the court placed no blame on Mr. Thomas for the accident.

Mitchell Guilty, Court's Verdict

Washington, Dec. 17.—A verdict of guilty on all specifications and the general charge coupled with a sentence of suspension for five years from "rank, command and duty" in the army, was found tonight against Colonel William Mitchell by the court martial which has been conducting the trial for insubordination since October 28.

The "military record of the accused during the World war" probably saved him from a more severe sentence. That was indicated by the court when it announced that the finding "is thus lenient."

Major General Robert L. Howze, president of the court, and the nine other members closed the court at 3:40 o'clock this afternoon for findings. At precisely 6:34, or two hours and 54 minutes later, the sentence and verdict was announced in these words:

"The court upon secret written ballots, two-thirds of the members present at the time the vote was taken concurring in each finding of guilt, finds the accused guilty of all specifications and the charge, upon secret written ballots.

"The court sentences the accused to be suspended from rank, command and duty, with forfeiture of pay and all allowances for five years.

"The court is thus lenient because of the military record of the accused during the world war, two-thirds of the members who were present at the time the vote was taken concurring."

Kittrell College Gets \$750,000 From S. N. Duke

Durham, Dec. 13.—Announcement of a gift of \$750,000 to Kittrell college, Kittrell, N. C., by S. N. Duke, of Durham and New York, was made here today by J. M. Avery, secretary of the board of trustees of that institution. The money is to be expended in the erection of new buildings and the purchase of new and needed equipment during the next 12 months. The gift announced today brings Mr. Duke's gifts to the negro college to more than a million dollars.
