SPECIAL SCHOOL ELECTION

By order of the Board of Commissioners of Surry County, there will be held an election at Cook's Schoolhouse on April 13, 1925, in the following territory:

Beginning at the old ford across Tom's Creek, near Job Jessup's running nearly North with Tom's Creek to a point Northeast from C. E. Cain's where road crosses Tom's Creek; then North of West following the old district to R. L. Arrington's South line and along McRoberts' South boundary, also W. E. Thomas' South boundary to top of ridge; then following ridge to a point North of Lewis Armstrong's; thence South-east along S. A. and D. C. Brinkley's East boundary; thence following present district line toward the South to the beginning near Job Jessup's. Being known as Cook's District, Westfield Township, District No. 8.

Said election will be held for the purpose of ascertaining the will of the qualified voters of the said district on the proposition of levying annually a tax of not exceeding 50c on the valuation of property, for the purpose of supplementing the said fund for said school district.

The registration books will be opened on Friday, the 12th day of March, and will be open for the purpose of registering voters and will be kept open every day, excluding Sunday, up to and including Saturday the 3rd day of April, 1925. The books will be open every day but Saturdays at the home of H. E. Taylor and on Saturdays at the polling place, from 9 o'clock in the morning until sun-down.

H. E. Taylor is appointed registrar for said election and Joel S. Cook and W. H. Taylor are appointed as judges for said election.

There will be an entirely new registration. No one can vote in said election without registering.

The polls for said election will be open on Tuesday morning, the 13th day of April, at sun-up and will remain open until sun-down and not afterwards.
