FOUR CONSPIRATORS DIE ON THE GALLOWS

Execution Is Postponed Until Nearly Midnight of Friday, Moslem Holy Day.

Constantinople, Aug. 27.—So an not to shock religious sentiment by executions on Friday, the holy day of the Moslem world, the four unionists who were sentenced to death yesterday at Angora on charges of conspiring to slay Mustafa Kemal Pasha, president of Turkey, were hanged just before the midnight hour.

The executed men were Djavid Bey, former finance minister; Dr. Nasim Bey, former minister of education, and one of the leaders of the 1908 revolt against the late Sultan Abdul Hamid; Hilmi Bey, a former deputy, and Nail Bey, a former secretary of the unionist party.

Four gallows were erected in the public courtyard before the Central prison in Angora and so arranged that the condemned men could not see one another die.

All died bravely. Djavid Bey, on mounting the scaffold declaimed Turkish poetry. Nail Bey sat him-

self down on the gibbet platform and when ordered to arise, executed himself, remarking humorously that it was the first time he had ever found himself in such a situation. He begged the officials to see properly to his hanging.

The rope slipped off the gallows arm when Hilmi Bey was executed and he had to be hanged over again. All the men protested their innocence of the charges against them. Their bodies were left exposed to public view until morning, a gruesome sight in their white overalls.

Tobacco Geography.

There is more than acreage and price and manufacture of tobacco. This is geography as well.

The tobacco production in North Carolina, like Gaul, is divided into three parts.

First, there is the "Old Tobacco Belt," including all the counties west of Raleigh and Moore, Vance, Warren and Franklin.

Second, the "Eastern Bright Belt," including all the counties south and west of Raleigh, except Fobeson, Columbus and Bladen.

Third, the "Border Tobacco Belt," embracing South Carolina, Georgia and the counties in North Carolina joining South Carolina. This is the newest belt.

Last Sunday The News and Observer gave fine stories about the marked development in Ebbeson and Columbus and the new big tobacco markets of Lumberton, Fairmont, Fair Bluff, Whiteville, Chadbourne and Taber. The prices paid on these new markets exceeded those of last year and the crop is reported excellent.

Today is the story of the Eastern belt, extending from Raleigh to the ocean. It is a story of notable progress and prosperity of an industry wholly developed in this generation, producing more than 350,000,000 pounds of bright tobacco.

Later the story of the "Old Tobacco Belt," west of Raleigh will be told in these columns. It is in the "Old Tobacco Belt" that the great tobacco manufacturing cities of Durham and Winston-Salem and Reidsville are located, in which more tobacco is manufactured than anywhere else in the world.
