**NEGRO DROWNS AT BAPTIZING**  
**Deacon Green, Follower Of Charlotte's "Black Christ" Drowns Before Eyes of Crowd.**  
 Charlotte, Sept. 27.—Ten thousand persons looked on yesterday at Clinton lake as Willie Green, negro deacon of "Bishop C. M. Grace's house of prayer" was drowned during a baptismal ceremony.  
 Green, overcome with religious fervor, waded into water over his head and went down before rescuers from the bank could save him. A negro physician pronounced the deacon dead after working with him some time.  
 The "bishop" baptized 700 negro converts during the afternoon. The self-declared "faith-healer" immersed more than 600 only a few weeks ago.
