On next Friday evening at six o'clock in front of the Blue Ridge Hotel of Mount Airy the chickens turned in by those boys and girls will be sold at auction to the highest bidder. One member of the Kiwanis Club has stated that we can be assured that these chickens will bring a good price, this sale will be an innovation. The chickens are all fine stock and this will be a splendid opportunity for some one to start a flock with as good fowls as can be found in the county. 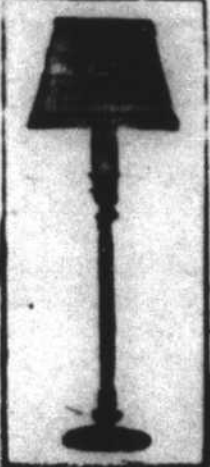

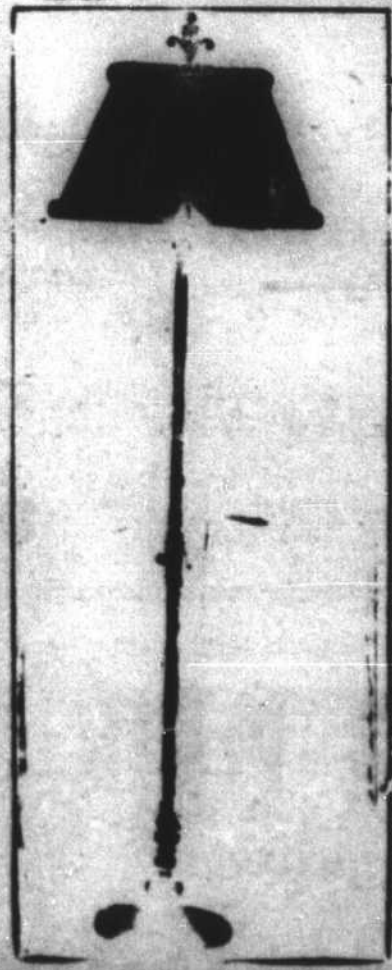
