### Tribute To Albert Poe Owen.

Mount Airy, Route 1, Oct. 26.—Albert Poe Owen was born in Davidson county December 27, 1876, died at the home of his brother M. L. Owen, Mount Airy Route 1, Oct. 25, 1926, aged 49 years 9 months and 28 days.

He came to Surry county when he was but a boy, was married to Fatima Barker in 1902, no children blessed this union. She departed this life July 5, 1915. Mr Owen was known by his friends and neighbors as "Uncle Dock" he was a skilled cabinet workman and in his younger days made furniture and coffins at his shop near McGee's store on the Old Hollow road. Many of the older people in the surrounding country have pieces of hand made walnut furniture made by "Uncle Dock" Owen that they prize very much. The outstanding characters of his life was his unassuming nature and his love for his home and companion, their married life was a model of love and companionship, noticeable and commented on by all who knew them, since the death of his wife eleven years ago "Uncle Dock" has mourned her loss. His greatest comfort came from caring for her grave which he visited daily as long as he was able, and from reading the New Testament which he had read through one hundred and thirty-six times in the past eleven years. He was one among the oldest members of the church at Hollow Springs and attended services regularly as long as his health would permit.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday at 2:30 P. M. by Rev. J. W. Simmons at Hollow Springs and his remains laid to rest beside those of his loving companion in the cemetery near by.
