W. A. HARRIS FELL ASLEEP AT NOLAN

Former Surry Man A Pioneer Of Mingo And Pike Counties.

"The Mingo Republic" pays a wonderful tribute to W. A. Harris, formerly of Surry county, who died at the age of 78 years at his home, Meadowbrook farm, on Big creek, opposite Nolan W. Va., Sunday, Jan. 16. Mr. Harris was the eldest son of a Confederate soldier's family of eleven and endured the bitter privations and hardships of the years following the war and assisted his mother in raising the younger children. In 1874 he and his uncle crossed the mountains foot and working their way through Southwest Virginia and Eastern Kentucky finally locating in the Tug River Valley, where he became one of the staunchest pioneers of that section. Farming, study, teaching, saw mill operating, bank direction, Sunday School superintendent, member of the school board and church deacon are among the many activities by which this man left his imprint on that section of the country and helped to lay the foundation of community life by which later generations may have advantages undreamed of in his boyhood days.

His wife, eight worthy sons and daughters, and five brothers and sisters survive him, among the brothers being Mr. Robert Harris, of this city. Mr. Harris also has many other friends and relatives in this section who while they grieve over his passing will be thankful for his full rich life which has done so much for his fellow man.

Rebekah Charter To Be Granted Mount Airy Odd Fellows.

A delegation from the Evangeline lodge in Winston-Salem composed of Mr. and Mrs. R. F. Simmons, Mrs. W. E. Beck and W. L. Thornton addressed local Odd Fellows and wives, mothers, sisters and daughters of Odd Fellows in the lodge assembly room Thursday evening.

The meeting was called at the desire of the local men who are very anxious to establish a branch of the Rebekah order in this city after the visitors had explained the object and duties of membership. A canvas resulted in 27 being enrolled for charter membership. The Rebekah lodge is the branch of the order in which women may hold membership though Odd Fellows may also belong. The degree team from the Evangeline Rebekah lodge of Winston-Salem will confer the degree at a meeting to be held February 24. So anxious were the Odd Fellows to establish this branch of the order here they offered to divide time with the Rebekah lodge so that the new organization would have no expense of rent etc. The new organization will be known as the Mary Rebekah lodge.

Town Clock Winston-Salem Bought By Church.

At a meeting of the Board of Aldermen, of Winston-Salem, Friday night the historic old time piece which has proclaimed the time from the belfry in the City Hall of that metropolis for more than a quarter of a century was sold to representatives of Calvary Moravian Church for the sum of \$300.00 and a wire was sent to the Seth Thomas Clock Co. requesting that a man be sent at once to take charge of the work of removing the clock from the old City Hall, which will be torn down to make way for modern business structures, and putting it up either in the belfry, tower or gables of the church. When the church was built space was reserved in the belfry for a clock but the church has never placed one there, the location of the clock will be left to the discretion of the expert from the clock company, the Seth Thomas Co. being the company from which the clock was purchased in 1892. The church property is located corner Holly avenue and Poplar streets.

The old clock has been wound and set once a week by a Winston-Salem jeweler and has been a guide for the traveling public when in that city as well as the residents of Winston-Salem, it has been a good time-keeper rarely ever stopping except when the hands were frozen in sleety weather and then as soon as the sleet melted it was on the job again. Many of our readers will feel glad the old clock is not to go into the discard because the march of progress decrees that the old Winston-Salem City Hall shall give place to modern business structures.
