

FERTILIZER CORN TEST TO BE MADE THIS YEAR

Interesting Test Will Be Made by Prof. Benson in Interest of Agriculture.

Professor B. J. Benson, of the Agricultural Department of Dobson High School, will conduct a fertilizer

demonstration with corn this season, in addition to his many other activities.

"Corn," says Professor Benson, "is one of our most important crops, yet it is the most neglected crop. The purpose of our demonstration is to determine what kind and what amount of fertilizer should be applied to produce the largest yield at the least cost per bushel."

"Corn can be grown on most any type of soil, but it does best on a loamy soil containing large amounts of organic materials. The plant must have, also, plenty of soil moisture and an abundant supply of nitrogen. One of these essentials without the other will surely result in a poor crop, if not a complete failure. Plenty of humus, turned into the soil, helps the physical condition of the soil and aids in storing up a good supply of soil moisture."

"Experiments indicate that liberal amounts of a quickly available nitrogen fertilizer, applied when the corn is from knee to thigh high, is essential if good yields are expected. At this stage of the plant's life it has developed a mass of roots, extending all through the soil, which are hungry and thirsty for food."

"Since nitrogen in Nitrate of Soda

is the kind the plant likes best and since it readily dissolves in the soil moisture, there can be no better fertilizer for corn than this material. Our demonstration will compare Nitrate of Soda with some of the slower acting forms of nitrogen, such as cottonseed meal."

"We are taking this opportunity," says Professor Benson, "to call attention to this important demonstration. The location of this demonstration will be announced later. You will be interested in watching what takes place on this demonstration."

Selling Nails Out of White House Four For One Dollar

Washington, April 14.—Workmen engaged in repairing the White House have struck upon a novel scheme for increasing their weekly stipend. They sell nails from the job to tourists at four for \$1.

With the nails from the old part of the structure the tourists receive an interesting and intriguing story of their historical background. The nails are claimed by the carpenters to be more than 100 years old and of the old hand made variety imported from England before nail making thrived in the United States.

The black spots on the nails are explained by the fact that the White House was destroyed by the British by fire in 1814.

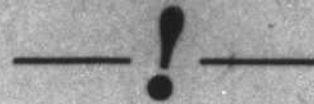
