### Wilkes County Note Affairs May be Solved Soon

Winston-Salem, August 8.—Hand-writing experts of the investment brokerage firms of Curtis and Stanger and of the National City Bank of New York, will compare with notes they hold, the signatures of Claude C. Few, chairman of the Board of Education of Wilkes County, and C. C. Wright, secretary, and of A. Brewer, chairman of the board of commissioners of Wilkes, and J. C. Wallace, secretary. They are to view the Wilkes papers, says a press dispatch from North Wilkesboro to a local paper.

Attorney Mark Squires, of Lenoir, has obtained the signatures of the county and school board officials, had them duly certified and with certified stamps of the seals of both boards will take them to New York for the purpose of helping the bankers who invested in what they thought to be gilt edged securities to trace down alleged forgeries. Each official wrote his name twice on the blank sheet of paper used for that purpose. In the presence of the solicitor impressions in wax were taken of the seals of the two boards. Photostatic copies of some of the \$150,000 notes outstanding have been received in Wilkesboro, but the bankers were not satisfied with the opinion as to the authenticity and regularity of names signed to them.

Robert H. McNeil, Washington lawyer, and son of Deputy Federal Court Clerk Milton McNeil, went to New York last week at the behest of Solicitor Jones and arrived in Wilkesboro with what is termed valuable data and correspondence from the big financial concerns who hold what are alleged to be the spurious notes of the Wilkes County school board and of the board of county commissioners. It is learned that the New York bankers will lend every assistance in their power to the North Carolina prosecutor who is seeking to get at the facts in regard to the notes.
