**JUBILEE SERVICE HELD AT SALEM CHURCH**

**For 50 Years Dr. Rondthaler Has Served as Moravian Bishop; Gets Purse**

Winston-Salem, Oct. 25.—A service jubilee, commemorating fifty years of continuous service of the Rt. Rev. Edward Rondthaler, DD., LL.D., in the southern province of the Moravian church, was held in the Home church this afternoon. In order to accommodate the large number of friends of his own and other denominations, two love feasts were held, first one taking place at 2 o'clock and the second at 4. The old house of worship was filled on both occasions.

Bishop Rondthaler, who is a native of Schoenock, Pa., and the oldest Moravian bishop in the world came to this city in 1877 from Philadelphia, where he served the First Moravian church as pastor from 1873 until his acceptance of the call to the local charge. In addition to being pastor, for a few years he was also president of Salem College, the famous Moravian school here. He was consecrated bishop in 1891.

A program of sacred music featured the celebration and the united Moravian hands gathered on the old Salem Square and played several selections which added interest to the occasion.

Bishop Rondthaler, who is now 85 years old, is still remarkably active for his age. He is able to keep in personal touch with all affairs pertaining to the province.

As a token of esteem and appreciation for his long and faithful serv-

ice, Bishop Rondthaler was presented with a handsome purse, a gift from the laymen of the province. The amount is said to have been \$500 in gold.
