NUTS AND TIMBER IN BLACK WALNUT

Most Valuable Timber Grown in State and Big Demand For Nuts

The black walnut makes an ideal dual purpose tree for the North Carolina farmer. As timber, it produces the most valuable lumber grown in the State.

Plain grain walnut logs are selling today at \$50.00 to \$100.00 per thousand board feet depending upon size and quality.

Stumps gathered for shipment at railroad stations have been noticed at many points in North Carolina recently including Mebane, Elmwood, Gibsonville, Smithfield, and others.

The demand from candy manufacturers, bakers, and others for walnut kernels, has made the harvesting of black walnuts a profitable business for many farm families.

The seed nuts should be planted during the late fall or early spring. Planting should be made in waste places about the farm, in openings throughout the woods, or as a regular crop in the open field.

For growing timber, nuts from any of the healthy, thrifty growing trees of the local community could be planted. Many of these trees will be found to produce high class nuts.

Recently, the writer met Mr. Wade Barber, of Pittsboro, N. C., who is this fall putting out 100 black walnut trees.
