## Two Aged Believers Die At Westfield

Westfield, Dec. 2.—Mr. Sam Inman, two miles west of the post office died yesterday of heart failure. Mr. Inman had been in bad health for quite a while. He was a good farmer and a good citizen and had many friends. He was a regular attendant of the Primitive Baptist Church but not a member. He was 75 years old and leaves a widow 75 and ten children five boys and five girls, all married, will be buried this evening at the Inman grave yard.

About the same hour Mr. W. M. Inman, who lived southwest of town about 2 1/2 miles from the post office passed away. He was about 70 years of age. He leaves 15 children. He had been in bad health for quite a while. Mr. Inman was a farmer and stood high in the estimation of this community. He was a member of the Primitive Baptist Church. A double funeral was held for the two men at the Westfield Baptist Church and a large crowd attended. Dr. Tom Smith, and Elder James Morrison officiating.
