The Atlanta Journal says of three Republican enemies of the south: "Pritchard, Chandler and Lodge are preparing to howl in the senate for a force bill, but nobody will pay much attention to them."

State Labor Commissioner Hamrick truly says: "If our farmers could be induced to reduce the present acreage of cotton one-half and plant a greater variety of crops they would very greatly improve their condition and prospects."

The New York Journal makes a strong point when it shows that under the Republican system of taxation Mr. John D. Rockefeller, with an income of \$20,000,000 a year, need not pay any more tax than a working man whose income is \$500 a year. The Republican system of taxation is based on expenditures.
