No prayer meeting will be held at the Methodist and Presbyterian churches this evening on account of the union meeting tomorrow evening in the Christian church.

A lantern carnival at New Bern the first part of this week realized \$50 for the M. E. Sunday school of that city. Over 125 children were in the parade, which was pronounced by all to be an imposing sight.

The delegates from Kinston precincts Nos. 1 and 2 are requested to meet in the grand jury room Saturday at 11 o'clock for the purpose of nominating a township constable and eight magistrates.

Mr. G. B. Webb has received a convenient arrangement in the way of a casket truck for use in handling corpses indoors and at trains. It is mounted on pneumatic tired wheels and ball-bearing axles.

The Goldsboro people now claim that their opening sales on Friday, Aug. 1st, in round numbers amounted to two hundred thousand. This is a big difference, for at first they claimed they sold a half a million pounds.

Mr. Lewis Kilpatrick, who is a delegate from Contentnea Neck township, is probably one of the oldest men in the county to take active interest in public affairs. He is 84 years old and in full possession of all his faculties.

The sales on the tobacco market yesterday were not very large but the prices went beyond the expectation of anyone. Wood, of near LaGrange, who saw this, went to the buyer and asked if the price was not a mistake, but he found it was not.

The annual picnic at River Side church, Craven county, will be held Friday, August 22. Everyone is invited to attend and many dinner. Cold drinks, ice cream and other refreshments will be sold for the benefit of River Side church. The picnic address and social features of these picnics in the past have been instructive and beneficial. A large crowd is always there from Lenoir and Pitt, as well as from Craven county.
